Buckley Park College is proud to provide an outstanding secondary school experience for our students, and your voluntary financial contributions play an important role in this.

Your financial support has allowed us to offer a wider range of subjects, special curriculum experiences and enhanced digital learning opportunities for students across all year levels.

In 2024 we were able to direct your contributions towards:

- Commencing the process for science room upgrades and re-imagining existing classrooms to create spaces for the Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics (STEAM) program.
- Introducing an ongoing maintenance program across the school to repaint and re-carpet rooms and corridors to enhance the learning environment for students.
- Increasing and upgrading the sun-protected areas across the school to create learning spaces in the library courtyards and east of the portables.
- Landscaping courtyards and the library areas to create more useable and engaging outdoor spaces.

In 2025 we will focus on:

- Updating external lighting and CCTV facilities in C, D and E Blocks to support school safety.
- Continuing the ongoing maintenance program across the school, focusing on A, B and C blocks and the Locker areas.
- Extending landscaping projects across C and D block courtyards.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. However, the ongoing support of our families ensures that Buckley Park College can continue to offer the best possible education, support, and infrastructure for our students.

Payment methods

Our preferred payment method is via the booklist or the compass portal, through the payment centre on your dashboard. We also accept EFTPOS and Cash payments at the office or over the phone.

Refunds

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payments Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy, and any other relevant information. FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions	Other Contributions	Extra-Curricular Items and Activities
Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.	Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.	Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.
